#### Headteacher's News

Dear Parents and Carers

I am writing to wish you a wonderful summer. It has been a fantastic year at Moreland and we have much to be proud of. Thank you for all you do to support your children and the school community. We very much value feedback from parents and carers so please let us know anything more we can be doing to keep you involved in your children's learning and school life.

I was very pleased with the end of year results in Y1 Phonics and KS1 and KS2 results. All results were above, in line with or only marginally below the national results which considering the difficulties of the last few years and missed learning shows how hard the children and staff have worked. I will share these results online when we have had them finally validated in the autumn.

There have been many highlights for me, this year and I have particularly enjoyed seeing children have the opportunity to build their confidence and their curiosity about the world through the many enrichment and extra- curricular activities we offer at the school. My favourite moments have included witnessing the awe and wonder of children in KS1 and 2 watching a West End show, seeing children really embracing nature on the Year 5 residential in the South Downs - star gazing, jumping in puddles, rolling down hills...., singing with 6000 children at the Young Voices concert at the 02, seeing children's enjoyment of the Take One Picture project - through creating their own art and attending our school exhibition, our fabulous football team winning the league unbeaten all season and seeing the community come together for International Evening, our Christmas Carol concert (complete with Pedro the donkey) and our Eid celebration.

The last couple of weeks of term have also created many memorable moments for the children. The Year 6 performance of Pirates of the Curry Bean was a fitting performance to end the year with and we were proud to see how hard all the children and adults worked to put on a top rate show. I was particularly impressed with the positive attitude, hard work and quality of singing and acting this year.



Some children from Key Stage 2 took part in the Islington Dance Festival at Arts and Media School Islington last week showcasing the dance they had choreographed linked to the painting Surprised!. Thank you to Lauren who supported the children with this project.







Following our Take One Picture project in the summer term last year based on "A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas" some of the children were invited to help plan the National Gallery exhibition displaying work from school's across the country. They were also invited to the opening of the exhibition last week where they introduced the exhibition and our dance which features in the museum. The children excelled themselves and Hannah, Lauren and I were so proud to see the confidence with which they talked about the exhibition. They received so many compliments from visitors to the exhibition and the National Gallery staff.



We will be holding an exhibition again in September so that you can see all of the children's work for this year's project which includes art, music and dance. We will once again then be submitting the work to the National Gallery in the hope that it will be chosen for the exhibition at the gallery. We all wish the best of luck to our wonderful Year 6 children as they continue onto the next stage in their life. We know that they will work hard at Secondary school to be the best they can be and utilise everything that they have learnt during their time at Moreland. Children get to learn in a fantastic environment and experience a rich and creative curriculum. 

# Some lovely things that have been happening in our class recently.....

Nursery Willow / Lilac	We have been learning about different jobs and ways of life. We have discussed what we want to be when we grow up and what it might include. This year we have had lots of fun in Willow class, filled with lots of learning opportunities in and out of the setting. It has been a pleasure to see all the children settle into Nursery and make lots of progress. Have a great Summer full of fun!
Reception Pear / Beech	This term we have been taking part in the Take One Picture project. This year it is all about Henri Rousseau's painting Surprised. A painting that shows a tiger in the jungle. We went on a trip to visit a real tiger and have been learning a lot about protecting our planet and looking after animals that are endangered. In art we have been creating our very own Surprised Tiger.  Reception has had a fantastic final term! We have been reading all about looking after our planet, going on litter hunts and making posters to remind everyone to reuse, recycle and reduce. The children reused old t-shirts and socks to make them into brilliant bags and sock puppets. We had a go at growing our own cress, putting them in different places to see how they would grow. We were amazed to see the cress without sunlight was bright yellow! We went to London Zoo to see lots of animals and listen to some fantastic keeper talks. We made a class 'What am I2' book for everyone to guess which animal we were describing. In maths, we explored 2D and 3D shape by going on lots of shape hunts.
Year 1 Maple / Olive	What a year we have had in Maple class this year, from trips to Tower bridge, Transport Museum and London zoo to watching Frozen the musical and a wonderful puppet show at the little angel theatre to name but a few. The children have learnt so much and grown in confidence as well as height!!! Over the last few weeks we have been creating our art work for the Take one picture project with the National Gallery. Looking at the picture Surprised by Henri Rousseau.  Olive class have been busy this term. We worked hard learning our phonics for our Phonics Screening which went extremely well. We started our Take One Picture Project, researching everything about tigers and visiting them at London Zoo. Olive class have now created jungle viewing boxes for the art project. We have had a fantastic year in Olive class and the children are ready for their new journey in Year 2.
Year 2 Cherry	In literacy children have been learning how to write a story linked to our Art project. The children have been busy researching the internet to gather fascinating facts about the Art work of Henri Rousseau to enable them to create their own story around the painting. In Maths we have been learning how to solve simple word problems involving fractions and division. In Global citizenship we have discussed how to maintain a healthy environment.
Pine	This month we have been learning about a picture called Surprised! By Henri Rousseau. The children have taken inspiration from the picture to write stories about a tiger that lives in a rainforest. They have created tiger puppets and a rainforest scene using leaf hammering. This week they will tell the stories whilst recording these puppets to create a short film of their work.
Year 3 Palm /Ash	Palm - Reading: We have been reading Cinnamon by Neil Gaiman. In math we have looked at telling the time and conversion of hours and minutes, the duration in hours and minutes and addition and subtraction solving word problems. Then we went on to look at Angles, understanding and identifying angles. In English we have been exploring Tiger Poems based on the book Cinnamon. Children looked at different poems and acted out and performed the poems. They looked at conferencing and at the similarities and differences between different poems.  Ash - We are thrilled to share the latest highlights from our dynamic classroom. Recently, our eager learners have been diving into the fascinating worlds of shapes and fractions. They have been exploring the characteristics and properties of different shapes, uncovering their secrets and uncovering their connections to the world around us. Meanwhile, in English, our imaginative young writers have been crafting captivating poems, expressing their thoughts and feelings with eloquence and creativity. In our art sessions, the students have transformed shoe boxes into enchanting jungles, unleashing their artistic talents and creating miniature worlds filled with vibrant foliage and mesmerizing creatures. It's been an incredible journey of discovery and self-expression for our Ash Class students, and we couldn't be prouder of their achievements!
Year 4 Fir	In Fir Class we have been exploring poems and writing our own rainforest poems based on our Take One Picture painting, The Surprise.  In maths we have been exploring Roman Numerals and measurement and in these final two weeks we will be recapping any of the learning that we have found tricky this year. In art, we have been using our Take One Picture as inspiration for our own artwork. We created trees out of collage and charcoal, and using oil pastels and watercolours to create jungle animals.
Birch	In Birch class we have been using our new maths scheme White Rose maths to cover units of measure, Roman numerals and coordinates. In English children have been exploring a range of poems about the rainforest and have been learning about poetic devices. They had a chance to write a range of poems related to the Take One Picture project.
Year 5	In Rowan class we have been writing our own poems based off of The Tyger by William Blake. As well as this we have been creating our own artwork based on the Take one picture - Henri Rousseau's 'Surprised!' To add to our picture, we have been creating origami
Rowan	animals and flowers to put on the front.  This term, all of our learning has been based on the Take One Picture painting 'Surprise' by Henri Roussaeu. We have been exploring the theme of the jungle and creating a piece of artwork inspired by the painting. For our art project we took part in an origami workshop and have been creating origami flowers, tigers and birds. These will be attached to the paintings we have created in our art lessons. In English, we read the poem 'Tyger' by William Blake as well as a variety of other jungle/animal themed poems. We learnt about a range of poetic devices which we then used to write our own jungle poems. I am very proud of all of the work the children have
Year 6	done this year and I hope you all have a lovely, well-deserved summer break.  Year 6 have been working very hard and showing great dedication towards their fantastic performances of 'Pirates of the Curry Bean'.
Cedar	They have been singing, acting, dancing and making props to perfect their performance ready to show the school and the families! It has been lots of fun to work on and we are very proud of every child. Hard work has paid off!
