One of our focusses this term has been on having a reflection time during our assemblies. We light a candle, listen to music and think about the Moreland Vision:

It has been lovely to share this time together.

### Some lovely things that have been happening in our class recently...

for a second	
Nursery Willow	In Willow class we have been following our settling process. We have had a fantastic first month in Willow class getting to know our new children. The children have loved exploring the indoor and outdoor setting.
Lilac	Primarily settling into nursery but our topic is 'food and festivals'- reading Baby Goes to Market and Handa's Surprise, fruit and veg printing, baking biscuits, counting songs, sorting autumnal objects.
Reception Pear	In term 1 we have been exploring our environment and settling in. The children have been learning all about how to use the provision, making friends and learning routines. We have been enjoying learning a new poem with actions each week and reading the book Handa's Surprise. We had a go at acting out the story, making fruit smoothies and balancing fruit on our heads! In maths, we have been developing a mastery of number through recognising and representing numbers 1-3.
Beech	This term has been all about settling our children into our EYFS setting. We have been learning all about how to use the provision, making friends and learning rules and routines. This week we have been reading the book Handa's surprise, we have made patterns, tasted fruit, plotted Handa's journey and made smoothies. In our maths learning we have been recognising and representing numbers 1-3.
Year 1 Maple	Maple class have made a fantastic start to the new school year, we have been learning about our world, learning the 7 continents and 5 oceans, identifying stories from around the world and recently creating our own African stories. We are making great progress in maths and have been focussing on addition with in 10 and learning how to use the part whole method.
Olive	Olive class have had a busy start to our Autumn term. For our topic we have been learning about continents, climate and comparing different places in the world. For English we have been looking at stories from around the world and in maths we've been learning about number bonds using the part whole method. Olive class enjoyed their first school trip to Discover where they were immersed in 'The 100 Story Hotel'
Year 2 Cherry	The children started the new academic year very well and are enjoying their learning. In literacy we have been learning how to write different sentence types and we are planning to write a biography about Rosa Parks. In maths we have been working on counting, using concrete representation of numbers to 100. In history we have continued to study the life of some of the famous suffragettes. We have also completed our science topic on Healthy me. We had so much fun finding out about healthy and unhealthy food.
Pine	Pine Class have been settling into Year 2 brilliantly! In maths, they have been understanding place value in numbers up to 1000, and are beginning to put the numbers in ascending and descending order. In English, we have looked at the four sentence types; command, statement, question and exclamation. We have learnt all about the Suffragettes in History and are beginning to learn more about the life of Rosa Parks and her impact on the world we live in today.
Year 3 Palm	In English we have been looking at historical recounts focussing on Nelson Mandela. The children have been learning about place value in maths, numbers up to 10,000. In science we have been looking at magnets and what magnets do, the children had fun designing and making their own magnetic games.
Ash	This term the students have been working hard on an amazing topic in English, Nelson Mandela and his life! The students have been reading his autobiography and discussing the importance of his life to the freedom and equality of south Africa.
Year 4 Birch	In Birch class we have been learning about the Windrush. Children have been reading a novel called Coming to England in English. In science we have learnt about electricity and sound. Children had a go at testing a range of conductors and insulators in their bulb circuits. In maths we have been learning about place value and using the rule of rounding to round numbers to the nearest 10 and 100.
Fir	This term we have been working so hard in their learning. In science we explored electricity; we experimented with circuits and identified different insulators and conductors in the classroom. In literacy, we began reading our book 'Coming to England' and we have written several diary entries from the perspective of Floella Benjamin (the author). In PE we have been playing netball and developing our skills in gymnastics. In netball we recently learnt about the three passes, the over arm, the bounce and the chest passes.
Year 5 Rowan	This term we have been learning about the transatlantic slave trade. We have been learning how it was created, and key abolitionists, such Olaudah Equiano. In Maths we have been looking at numbers, particularly multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, and 1000. In English, we have been preparing to write a persuasive argument.
Sycamore	This term we have been looking at the history of slavery and have been focusing on the trans-Atlantic slave trade. We learnt about Olaudah Equiano and his key role in the abolitionist movement and even took a visit to the Museum of London Docklands. At the museum we visited the London, Sugar and Slavery gallery where we were able to see a number of objects and artefacts that highlighted London's involvement in the slave trade. In English we will be writing a persuasive speech in favour of the abolition of slavery. In maths we have covered numbers to one million and how to round to the nearest ten or hundred. We have also learnt how to multiply and divide by tens, hundreds and thousands using our knowledge of place value to help us.
Year 6 Cedar	Cedar Class have been learning all about Katherine Johnson and her incredible career at NASA. Using the book 'Hidden Figures' and clips from the film as inspiration, the children have written diary entries, performed role plays and have written and published some amazing biographies about her life. This has linked to our history and geography lessons about the Civil Rights Movement, where we have learnt about key events and figures from this time.
