Dear Parents and Carers

We have come to the end of another busy and fruitful term at Moreland. For me, this has been a very special term as I am extremely happy at being appointed the permanent Headteacher at Moreland. I have worked at Moreland for 14 years, starting as a part time early year's teacher in 2008, and I have known some of our families now for many years. I am very proud of our school and community and I look forward to working my hardest to ensure the school continues to provide the very best care and education for all our children. We are a very ambitious school and we have high aspirations for each and every child. As part of our Learning for Life vision we provide many opportunities for children to broaden their horizons and open their eyes and minds to the opportunities that are available to them if they believe in themselves, work hard, show resilience and a growth mindset.

Speaking of these skills, I was very proud to watch the football team play in the Slaughter and May League final this week. 

Some lovely things that have been happening in our class recently......

Nursery	In Willow class we have been learning about the story "Farmer Duck" and the different farm animals, their babies' names, animal
Willow	houses and which products come from farm animals. We are looking forward to our visit to Spitalfields farm.
	This term we have been looking at the book "Farmer Duck", we have been learning about the farm animal homes, and the names of their
Lilac	young. The children could name all the animals on the farm. We also went to visit a farm, some of the children have never seen these animals close up and so it was a valuable experience for them.
Reception	Our learning has been around the story What The Ladybird Heard. We visited the farm to support their learning about farm animals
Pear	and living things. They made their own maps like in the story, and even used a map to find their way around the school. In maths the
	children have focussed on 3D shapes and their properties.
	For literacy Beech class have been focusing on the book 'What the Ladybird Heard' which linked to an amazing trip to Spitalfields
	Farm. The children had the opportunity to pet and feed the animals. The children have been learning to write simple sentences
Beech	describing the trip, using their phonic knowledge to support them in their writing. For maths we have been comparing 2D and 3D shapes.
Year 1	We have had a very busy month focussing on our topic Enchanted woodlands. The children have been designing and making woodland
Maple	habitats out of cardboard and wood and learning what materials are best. We have created our own fairy stories and learnt lots of
	language around this theme.

Year 3 Palm	This term our topic has been Around the world in 80 days. We have been focusing on the novel by Jules Verne. We have used it as our
rum	inspiration for writing a country report all about India. In our Topic lessons we investigated all about the world looking at time zones and identifying lines of latitude and longitude. In maths we have been learning all about measurement. We have looked at mass, length
	and capacity. Lastly in science we have been learning all about rocks, identifying different rocks, grouping them and doing various

	This month the year 3's has been hard at work learning and researching about India! Having read Around the World in 80 Days, we have
	been identifying the key features of the amazing country of India! In science we have been exploring the different types of rocks, how
	they are formed and all their uses. The students have also had the chance to plant their own trees in the school ground where they will

Year 4 Birch	In Birch class we have been learning about decimals in maths. Children were able to use learning from the fractions unit to help them understand tenths, hundredths and thousandths. In English, children worked on planning and writing a mystery story based on the novel

Letter to all Parents about Term Time Leave

Dear Parent/Carer,

Re: Family Holidays and Special Leave in Term Time

I am writing to remind you of Moreland Primary School's policy about holidays during term time.

The law requires parents to ensure their child's regular attendance at school and normally we would not expect you to take your child out of school for a holiday. There is no automatic right to a holiday in term time.

When considering the timing of your family holiday, please remember the following:

- A two week term time holiday will mean that your child misses out on 10 literacy lessons and 10 numeracy lessons.
- Research shows that children often do not catch up from work missed this could have serious consequences for their learning and progress.
- Your child's term time holiday could affect other pupils the time teachers have to help all the children in a class is reduced if they spend time helping your child catch up after a holiday.
- There are 175 non-school days in each year for holidays, cultural experiences and family time.

If after these considerations you feel it is absolutely unavoidable to take your child on a holiday or special leave of absence in term time, you must make an application in advance. Forms are available from the school office and we request that you apply 4 weeks in advance of any proposed holiday or special leave.

The local education authority and the national government strongly discourage schools from allowing term time holidays. While you can be assured that each request will be considered on its individual merits, our practice is to only authorise holidays and leave in exceptional circumstances.

If we do agree to a holiday or leave in term time, it is very important that your child comes back to school on the date agreed. Failure to return could result in your child being deleted from the school roll or legal action being taken against you for the absence. Our school has a duty to keep children safe and this includes knowing where they are.

If you withdraw your child for a holiday during term time and we have not agreed to it, this absence will be unauthorised and could result in a penalty notice (a £60-£120 fine) or a summons to court.

Our aim is to ensure our pupils receive the most from their education and I hope we can count on your support in this matter.
