<b>Admission</b>	No charge may be made for admission to a maintained school	No Charge
<b>Provision of Education</b>	No charge may be made for provision of education during school hours. No charge may be made for costs incidental to the provision of education e.g. books, arts materials. Governors have discretion in respect of "optional extras" e.g. tuition in playing a musical instrument, activities outside school hours, school journeys, etc (see below).	No Charge
<b>Materials, Books, etc</b>	No charge may be made to parents or pupils for materials used as part of the national curriculum or for public examinations for which the pupil has been prepared at the school.	No Charge
	Charges may be made if parents want the product to be owned by the pupil.	Yes
	Ingredients/materials for practical subjects where parents indicate in advance that they or the child wishes to own finished product. Recommendation: invite contributions where article is to be retained	Yes
<b>Journeys</b>	No charges for educational activities/journeys that take place wholly or mainly during school hours or for educational activities/journeys that take places wholly or mainly outside school hours but are part of the National Curriculum or the syllabus for a public examination. <i>Reasonable charges may be made, in advance, for any non-statutory activities provided during school hours that have resulted in the school being charged for trips and experiences out of the classroom.</i>	No Charge

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	Charges may be made if the journey takes place wholly or mainly outside of school hours and is not part of the requirements of the National Curriculum or public examination syllabus.	Yes
	Charges may be made for board and lodging if the pupil has to spend one or more nights away from home, except where pupils are entitled to remission.	Yes
	Pupils are entitled to remission if parents are in receipt of income support, family credit, an income-based job seeker's allowance, disability working allowance.	Yes
<b>Extended Day Clubs</b>	Voluntary contribution of £15.00 per term for all clubs.	Yes
Breakfast Club	Sponsored by Greggs Bakery – £1.00 day	Yes
Playcentre	3:30 – 6:00 - Daily rate £ 10.00 per night	Yes
<b>Childcare</b>	We will charge families for any childcare offered to children before and after school (and during school holidays), with the level of fees and any remissions to be set and reviewed regularly by the governing body, and in accordance with any requirements set by the local authority where it is subsidising the provision and in accordance with LBI Early years day care charging policy. Charges are based on income assessment.	Yes
<b>30 hour free entitlement 3 &amp; 4 year old</b>	The introduction of the 30 hours Free Childcare from September 2017 allows parents, who meet the criteria, to access these hours at a setting/s of their choice. Eligibility checks are carried out every term This will, however, be dependent on the availability.	No
<b>Public Examinations</b>	No charge may be made in respect of the entry of a registered pupil at a maintained school for a prescribed public examination in any syllabus for that examination for which the pupil has been prepared at the school.(SATs)	No Charge

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<b>School Meals</b>	No charge for pupils entitled to free school meals as notified by the LEA, including refugees and asylum seekers. Pupils are permitted to a free school meal if the required FSM form has been completed.	No Charge
	If FSM form has been completed Islington Council currently fund Universal FSM to all Primary aged children in Islington If FSM form not completed Amount charged for each pupil meal to be set at £2.30	No
	Amount charged for adults to be set at £3.38 including VAT	Yes
<b>Activities Outside School Hours</b>	No charges may be made if the education is either part of the school's duty to implement the national curriculum or a necessary part of preparation for an examination.	No Charge
	Schools may ask parents to make a voluntary contribution towards these costs	Yes
	No charges for activities which do not fall into the above categories. If charges are to be made, they should be remitted for pupils from low income families.	No Charge
<b>Grant Income</b>	No charge for any activity or curriculum based tuition funded by specific grants.	No Mandatory Charge
